The white color in the painting is a symbol of purity. Most of the colors of Maleevich's works are of this color. M.Tashmurodov, F.Umarov and others among the artists creating in the modern artistic process use white color effectively.

Yellow is a color that leaves a warm impression on the viewer. The yellow-coated item is instantly appealing and seems to radiate light. It has been determined that this color has a rapid effect on human psychology. P.P. Benkov is an artist who used yellow color a lot in his works. He used more yellow in the play of light and shadow.

Red color means joy, beauty, love, perfect life, on the other hand, it is also a color that represents hostility, revenge, war, anger. Red is one of the main colors of nature. Also, the symbol of independence is red. Rozi Choriyev is one of our creators who loves red color in the painting art of Uzbekistan. He skillfully represented the women of Surkhandarya and their clothing through this color, thus pointing to the hot climate of the region.

Blue is the color of the sky and the sea. It embodies the calmness of a person, gives a cold breeze. The memories of the past come alive in the memory of a person looking at the blue or blue expanse. In many nations, blue is a symbol of eternity. If we look at the history of fine art, blue is the most used color in the murals of Afrosiyab and Bolaliktepa.

Green color is a symbol of grasses and greenery. The whole being is a symbol of the natural world. In many nations, it is a symbol of youth, hope and joy, adolescence. I.I.Shishkin and

I.I.Levitan are Russian artists who love to use green color in painting. Their landscapes have a positive effect on a person's psyche and give peace.

Black color in general is a color that represents sadness, the tragedy of living nature. In Turkic peoples, the word "black" means North, and at the same time, it also means great. In the art of painting, we can witness the use of more black color in the portraits of Abdulhaq Abdullayev.

Each work of art can show its effect on the viewer not only through color, but also through a combination of emotions. We know from history that our nation has been recognized as one of the nations rich in national traditions and values, culture and art. In addition, the diversity of nature and the mysterious faces of people are not overlooked by any artist.

Recently, Uzbek artists have created works that can be understood only through emotions. None of the works created by M. Isanov, J. Usmonov, B. Mahkamov, Kh. Ziyakhanov and others, who are currently creating, can be said to be devoid of emotion. Although the feeling itself is one thing, it creates an imagination in each person in a different spirit. Some people find it in their immediate surroundings, others in faraway places, or they may not be able to find it at all.

Usually line and color are always in harmony with each other. Although the line regulates and delimits the color, but the color cannot always be restrained. This situation, when reflected in the fabric, determines how deep the emotional world of the painter is. It can be shown that many artists often work in remote areas, in the heart of quiet nature, in connection with the world of emotions. It should also be mentioned that the harmony of color with other colors, appearance and direction of lines in each work has its own meaning.

A number of our artists have been working effectively in this regard. In the works called "Golden Autumn" by A. Mirsagatov, "Beautiful Zomin" by A. Boybekov, and "Breath of Spring" by H. Mirzaahmedov, it is possible to distinguish the emotional level of each artist. Although each artist has depicted landscapes, their lines, meaning and content are completely different from each other.

Because every artist tries to express some philosophical and scientific factors in his work through his inner feelings. This is because it shows that there is no limit to emotions. Of course, emotions cannot be shown as a perfect thing. If a person does not see anything, it means that there is no reserve, and because of this, he does not have an impression to describe something.

Therefore, emotion can be shown as a tool. Therefore, it cannot be seen or touched. It can be displayed in various forms in the works of painting. Some artist wants to show it through form, plasticity, dynamics, while another tries to express it in a completely different way.
