These characteristics often encourage women to choose professions and types of activity that do not require physical strength, but are solved by verbal means. For example, about 80% of workers in the fields of medicine, culture, household services, and education are women. In areas that require heavy manual labor and deep focused attention, it is considered natural for men to work mainly. At the same time, 15–20% of men are inclined to a lifestyle, thinking, and activity that is characteristic of women, and 15–20% of women are inclined to a lifestyle, thinking, and activity that is characteristic of men. In order for a person to express his talents and abilities and enjoy them, he needs not just to engage in a profession, but to engage in a profession that helps him fully express these talents and abilities. A profession is necessary not only for earning a living or supporting a family, a person is forced to do it.
