Through a professional designer's lens and an interview with Creative Director Shukhrat Asayev, the research explores the technical "re-engineering" of medieval Central Asian armor into functional 3D assets, a process termed "Digital Blacksmithing." The study examines the application of the "Marvel Formula"—global visual silhouettes and cinematic lighting—to historical Uzbek figures to enhance their appeal to a modern, global audience. Furthermore, the paper analyzes the emotional resonance of the film, specifically how high-quality visual effects and traditional musical motifs (such as the alla) create a visceral experience for the viewer. The findings suggest that "Sehrlandiya" sets a new benchmark for national animation by successfully balancing high-tech 3D logic with deep cultural semiotics, proving that historical identity can be effectively revitalized through contemporary visual storytelling.*

For many years, Uzbekistan children primarily consumed foreign offered entertainment and high visual quality, they often lacked local cultural context and national identity. Educators and cultural institutions began to recognize the importance of producing **original content that reflects local values, language, and worldview.**

*Sehrlandiya: A Heroic Mission* was created as a response to this need. The project aimed to combine global animation standards with storytelling that resonates with Uzbek children. It was designed not only to entertain but also to educate, inspire, and emotionally engage young audiences. By presenting familiar values through a modern visual language, the film helps children connect with the story on a personal level while developing imagination, empathy, and a sense of responsibility. In this way, *Sehrlandiya* serves as both a cultural product and an educational tool

### **Project Origins and Institutional Support**

The project was initiated by the **Children's content Development Center** under the Ministry of preschool and school Education of Uzbekistan. This institutional backing played a crucial role in transforming the idea into a large-scale cinematic production.

From the very beginning, the creators understood that producing a full-length 3D animated. Film would require long-term planning, financial investment, and professional coordination. the project became an example of how state support and creative industries an work together to develop national culture through modern media.

### **Lola production and the Creative Team**

The film was produced by **Lola Animation (Lola Production)**, a studio that undertook one of the most ambitious animation projects in the country's history. The studio was responsible for the entire production. Pipeline, including concept art, character design, modeling, animation, lighting, rendering, and post-production.

One of the most notable aspects of the production process was that many artists and animators involved were working on a **full-length 3D feature film for the first time**. This made *Sehrlandiya* not only a creative project but also a large-scale educational experience for the local animation community.

## Research-Based storytelling

Before finalizing the script and characters, the creative team conducted **research with children aged 6-12**. These studies revealed that children relate more strongly to characters who are imperfect, emotional, and capable of growth.

This insight shaped the film's core philosophy: **heroism is not about perfection, but about courage and responsibility**.

As a result, the main characters in *Sehrlandiya* are not traditional superheroes. They are ordinary children who experience fear, doubt, and uncertainty- emotions familiar to very young viewers.

## Story Overview

The narrative follows **four friends** who accidentally enter a magical parallel world known as *Sehrlandiya* through a mysterious portal. This world is filled with fantastical landscapes, magical beings, and ancient mechanisms.

The central conflict arises when the antagonist **Olabo'ji** attempts to gain control over a powerful time machine. His plan threatens not only the magical world but also the real one. Faced with this danger, the children must take responsibility and act, despite their fear and inexperience.

The story emphasizes that success is only possible through **teamwork, trust, and mutual support**. Each character contributes in their own way, reinforcing the idea that everyone has value.

## Characters and Psychological Depth

Each character in *Sehrlandiya* is designed with a distinct personality. Some are bold and impulsive, others cautious and thoughtful. This diversity allows children to identify with different characters and understand that there is no single "correct" way to be brave.

The antagonist Olabo'ji is portrayed as more than a simple villain. His motivations are rooted in ambition and inner conflict, making him a complex character rather than a purely evil figure. This approach helps children and actions, rather than viewing the world in simple black-and-white terms.

## Visual Style and Technical Achievement

From a technical perspective, *Sehrlandiya* represents a breakthrough for Uzbek animation. The film includes:

- Over **75 unique 3D character models**
- Multiple fully developed fantasy environments
  - Advanced lighting and texture techniques

The visual style balances colorful fantasy with clarity, ensuring that the film remains engaging without overwhelming young viewers. The attention to detail reflects the studio's commitment to achieving international-quality visuals.

## Voice Acting and Sound Design

The characters are voiced by well-known **Uzbek actors**, adding emotional authenticity and cultural familiarity. Voice acting plays a crucial role in animated films, and in *Sehrlandiya*, it helps establish a strong emotional connection between the characters and the audience.

The soundtrack and sound design further enhance the sense of adventure and magic, supporting the narrative.

Our guest for today's feature is **Shukhrat Asayev**, a seasoned expert who has been a pillar of the animation industry since 2007. Currently serving as the Director of "**Lolo Animation**" studio, Shukhrat brings a wealth of experience from his six-year tenure at major firms like "Unite-soft." Today, he is leading the creative vision for "**Sehrlandiya**," an ambitious project that is turning a new page in Uzbek animation.

### **A Fresh Perspective on Historical Costumes**

When work began on the "Sehrlandiya" project, the primary focus was on the visual identity of the characters, specifically their attire. According to Shukhrat Asayev, the armor worn by legendary figures like **Amir Timur** or **Jaloliddin Manguberdi** in the film are not mere drawings—they are carefully engineered assets.

In creating these characters, we aimed to preserve their historical authenticity while adapting them to the 'superhero' standards that today's youth admire," says Asayev

### **Armor Mechanics and Design Logic**

One of the most complex aspects of the project is the **3D functionality** of the armor. During our conversation, Asayev highlighted a crucial point for designers: in reality, medieval armor was incredibly heavy and restricted movement. In animation, however, the character must move with fluid, dynamic ease.

The "Sehrlandiya" team solved this by segmenting the armor into modular pieces. For instance, when a hero raises their arm, the shoulder plates slide over each other, preventing any restriction of movement. In this process, every detail—from the stitching on a boot to the silhouette of a hairstyle—is meticulously crafted to match the character's personality.

### **Why the "Marvel" Aesthetic?**

Addressing a common question about the film's visual style, Asayev provided a compelling insight. He noted that today's younger generation has developed a "visual palate" accustomed to the high-quality standards of global brands like Marvel.

"If we want to make our history and our heroes interesting to children, we must communicate with

them in a visual language they recognize—using modern cinematic lighting and powerful, heroic silhouettes."

### **Advice for Designers: Nature is the Ultimate Teacher**

To wrap up our interview, Shukhrat Asayev shared his "golden rule" for aspiring designers. He believes that the most perfect color palettes and structural harmonies can only be found in the natural world.

"Design is all about observation. The structure of a tree, the play of colors on a leaf—these are ready-made textbooks. A designer should not rely solely on what is on their monitor; they must step out into nature and learn to translate that organic beauty into their digital work."

### **Conclusion**

"**Sehrlandiya**" is more than just an animated film; it is a showcase of how national history can be successfully integrated with cutting-edge technology. Through the vision of Shukhrat Asayev and his team, Uzbek animation is setting a new global standard for visual storytelling.
